SHOW COOKING HINTS

- READ SCHEDULE CAREFULLY -

Chocolate Cake – Fine soft texture. Blend cocoa with a little hot water and cool before adding to mixture.

Chocolate/Coconut Balls – Place on appropriate plate/bowl size

Orange Cake – Fine even texture, even golden brown surface, well flavoured with orange. Rind can be used.

Cup Cakes – Moist, fine texture, nice peak to rise above paper.

Plain Sponge – No butter. Two layers of identical thickness, weigh each tin to obtain same amount in each. Should be pale in colour, light and soft in texture, not sticky and no cooler marks.

Scones – Dainty 5 cm rounds. Uniform shape and colouring, free from excess flour. Glaze with melted butter after cooking, to be open at top and DON'T screw cutter, select scones from the first rolling of dough.

Fruit Cake – Cut all fruit to size of a currant, round tins better than square.

Paper lining 5cm above tin, use hands to mix ingredients. Don't scrape sides of bowl and put last bit on top of cake mixture. Too hot an oven causes cracks, wrap cake in tin foil immediately after taking cake from oven and allow to cool. Remove cake from tin next day and re-wrap in foil to store.

Bumping tin on table a few times helps remove air bubbles before cooking for fruit cakes and plum puddings. Make 21 days before Show.

Cut butter into small cubes and rub into dry ingredients, making a ball with mixture. Divide mixture in to half Roll onto a gluten free floured board. Cut into fingers. Cook 150 deg C (no higher) for up to 1 hour. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with castor sugar

An Exhibitor having won at a Show, will be required to bake another cake for entry in the Group Final. The winner will be required to bake a further cake for the State Final at the next Royal Melbourne Show.

An exhibitor having won at Show level is not eligible to enter any other Show in this section until after the Group Judging, when, if not the winning entry, can compete further.

An exhibitor having won Group level cannot compete further until the Royal Melbourne Show.

Each cake entered must be a bona fide work of the Exhibitor. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final, then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.

CLASS 1: RICH FRUIT CAKE

The following recipe is **compulsory** for all entrants in this section.

RICH FRUIT CAKE

250g (8oz) sultanas	¼ teaspoon Grated Nutmeg
250g (8oz) chopped raisins	½ teaspoon Ground Ginger
250g (8oz) currants	½ teaspoon Ground Cloves
125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel	250g (8oz) butter
90g (3oz) chopped glace cherries	250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds	½ teaspoon vanilla essence
⅓ cup sherry or brandy	½ teaspoon almond essence
250g (8oz) plain flour	½ teaspoon lemon essence
60g (2oz) self raising flour or finely grated lemon rind	
4 large eggs	

Here is what you do:

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover, leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
3. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 – 3 pieces, cherries into 4 to 6 pieces and the almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

The following recipe is **compulsory** for all entrants in this section.

Here's what you need:

375g (12oz) Mixed Fruit	2 eggs lightly beaten
¾ cup brown sugar	2 tablespoons marmalade
1 teaspoon mixed spice	1 cup self-raising flour
½ cup water	1 cup plain flour
125g (4oz) butter	¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda	½ cup sherry

Here's what you do:

1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large

saucepan and bring to the boil.

2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool.
3. Add sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1-1 1/2 hours, or until cooked when tested.
